On November 4, 2012 at the age of 79. Raised in Lexington, Massachusetts and a 1955 Biochemistry graduate of Tufts University. Graduate degrees from Boston University and George Washington University He served for thirty years as a line officer aboard destroyers and amphibious ships. Ashore he served on staffs of the Supreme Allied Command, Atlantic; United Nations Command, Korea, He was special assistant to Commander, Second Fleet; to Commander in chief Southern Europe; and to the Director, Central Intelligence Agency. He also taught at Women Officer School, French Naval Academy in Brest, France and was Chairman of Military Strategy Department at the National War College. Following his Naval career he was affiliated with Booz, Allen Hamilton as Director of Business Strategy and of the firm's first Senior Leadership Development Program. For the past twenty five years he has been a professor for the Naval War College Distant Learning Program. He was named professor emeritus from the National War College and the first adjunct professor for the Naval War College. He was a member of the International Institute for Strategic Studies, London; the Corporate Board of the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute and the New York Yacht Club. A service will be held at the Fort Myer Memorial Chapel on Tuesday, April 30 at 10:45 a.m. immediately followed by internment at Arlington National Cemetery with full military honors. A reception will follow at the Fort Myer Officers Club. He is survived by his loving wife, Sally, of 56 years; daughters Sara Thibault and Suzanne Thibault Payne and her husband RADM Tilghman Payne and two grandchildren, all of Alexandria.
