

Adm Raymond Paul Hunter

US Navy Rear Admiral. Hunter's early education was in the public schools of Sherman, Texas. He enrolled at the University of Texas the following year and completed one year before realizing he wanted to attend the Naval Academy. He graduated from the Naval Academy in 1931 and received his commission as an Ensign. His first duty after graduation was onboard the USS Maryland and next served on the Cruiser U.S.S. Quincy. At the outbreak of World War II Hunter was assigned to the battleship U.S.S. Washington and was in the Battle of Savo Island as well as the Battle for Guadalcanal. Hunter was named the Commanding Officer of the destroyer U.S.S. George K. MacKenzie in August of 1948 commanding her until September 1949 and next was assigned to the Joint Chief of Staff on temporary duty. Hunter was promoted to Captain in 1950 and was appointed the Commanding Officer of the Attack Cargo Ship U.S.S. Muliphen from June 23, 1953 to March 31, 1954. Hunter retired as a Rear Admiral and lived at Washington, D.C.
