Stanton R. Price, 85, died January 7, 2014. Stanton was born and raised in Lakewood, NJ. He entered the [US Navy](#) and served his country during the [Korean War](#) conflict. After his military service he entered Trenton State College acquiring a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Industrial Education. After graduation in 1960 he accepted a teaching position as a High School Automotive Instructor in the Bridgewater Township school system. He remained in this capacity for over thirty years serving at Bridgewater-Raritan HS West, and then transferring to Bridgewater-Raritan HS East, ultimately retiring in 1990. His service to God, country, and community remains as a hallmark testimony. Combining his love for country and youth he was commissioned a Lieutenant Commander in the U.S. Naval Sea Cadets Corps. Inspiring young adults in the service of their country. Stanton was an active member of the North Branch Church where he served as an elder and deacon as well as participating on various church committees. He is predeceased by his wife, Carina D. Price in 2004.
