Norfolk - A 21 year old Navy enlisted man stationed aboard the USS **Muliphen** was killed late Friday, April 3, 1959 in a collision near La Plata, Maryland. Maryland State Police identified him and he was from Wilslip, New York. Four other men stationed on the **Muliphen**, an attack cargo ship, were involved in the accident, but two reportedly escaped without significant injuries. S.C. PARISI Junior, 21 of New York City, suffered a minor brain concussion and DAVID LASSITER, 20 of Boston, a broken arm. Both were admitted to Bethesda Naval Hospital. Neither's condition was reported as serious. JAMES E. GRAY and EDWIN ORTIZ, who's home addresses were not immediately available, were examined at the hospital and released. The police said PARISI was the driver of the car which was going south on US 301, 11 miles south of La Plata, when it collided with a north bound car driven by JOHN D. LOWE Junior of White Plains, Maryland. LOWE was admitted to a hospital in La Plata.
